

Responsive Reading “He is Our King”

LEADER: As we prepare for Advent, we remember
that the One who was to come, has come,
and is to come, is our King.

PEOPLE: *He will be great, and will be called the Son
of the Most High, and the Lord God will give
to him the throne of his ancestor David.* (Lk. 1: 32)

LEADER: But he did not come as the king expected.

PEOPLE: *“My kingdom is not of this world.”* (Jn. 18: 36)

LEADER: Some recognized him when he came.

PEOPLE: *Magi from the east came to Jerusalem
and asked, “Where is the one who has been born
king of the Jews?”* (Mt. 2: 1 & 2)

LEADER: And some did not.

PEOPLE: *“We don’t want this man to be our king.”* (Lk. 19: 14)

LEADER: Nonetheless, we do proclaim him as our king.

PEOPLE: *The kingdom of this world has become
the kingdom of our Lord, and of his Christ,
and he shall reign forever and ever.* (Rev. 11: 15)

LEADER: So then, in a culture that despises authority, we will
declare Jesus, the Christ, to be ruler of our hearts.

PEOPLE: We will follow him, trust him,
and seek to be faithful to him
in our living, our loving,
our speaking, and our thinking.

LEADER: In a culture that believes history is just a series
of meaningless cycles, we declare that history
is heading toward a culmination,

ALL: and we eagerly await the triumphant return
of our glorious king.

Hallelujah! Amen!
